in the beginning

It seems fitting that the history of automobile mass production began in 1901 with a car designed, built and driven by Henry Ford. Raced to victory at Grosse Pointe, Michigan, Henry's success gained the interest of financial backers and enabled him to found the Ford Motor Company. Three years later, at the wheel of the 999 (below). Henry set a new land speed record of 91.37 mph on the frozen surface of Lake St Clair, Michigan. Everyone loves a winner.



ford**GT40** Mk IV **1967**

The 40-inches-high GT40 began its run of Le Mans victories in 1966 with a 1-2-3 clean sweep. The GT40 went on to also win the 1967, '68 and '69 Le Mans 24-hour high-speed endurance phenomenon.

the **1960s**

The 'swinging 60s' saw Ford forge powerful partnerships with names that would become motorsport legends – Cosworth, Lotus, Hill, Clark and Stewart. At Le Mans, Ford's GT40 repeatedly crushed the spirits of Ferrari and Porsche. In the Indianapolis 500, Ford-powered Lotus' driven by Jim Clark, Graham Hill and Jackie Stewart all had spectacular victories. And the Ford Cosworth DFV engine began its unparalleled track record of 155 Grand Prix wins.

lotusford 38 1965

In 1965, Jim Clark won America's greatest race, the Indy 500, in his Ford-powered Lotus 38.

lotus**ford** 49 **1967**

In its debut at the 1967 Dutch GP, the Ford Cosworth DFV engine romped home to victory with Graham Hill on pole and Jim Clark taking the chequered flag in Lotus Fords. This was Ford's Formula One debut and a resounding victory.



the **1970s**

The 1970s saw Lotus and Ford continue their partnership success. Both Tyrrell and McLaren also saw the benefits of powering their cars with a Ford engine. In fact, in 1973 when Jackie Stewart won his third Formula One Championship in a Lotus, Ford's DFV engine won every race of the season. Throughout the 70s Ford engines powered nearly all the F1 teams on the circuit. On the Rally front too, the Ford Escort team would prove to be formidable, ending the decade as World Rally Champions.

tyrrellford 003 1971

Jackie Stewart in the Tyrrell confounded pre-season favourites Ferrari by winning six Grand Prix titles and the Formula One Championship.

In the previous 1970 season, Stewart moved to Tyrrell, but could not maintain the form which won him the 1969 World Championship. However, Jochen Rindt became sport's only posthumous World Champion in the Ford-powered Lotus 72.

the **escort** era

Beginning in 1970 with the RS1600, Ford Escort's reputation for performance and handling took rally driver Hannu Mikkola on to win the gruelling London to Mexico World Cup Rally. In 1972, he became the first non-African to win the East African Safari. He also won three RAC rallies in this decade.

ford**escort** RS1800 **1979**

After an eighth consecutive RAC win, Mikkola and the invincible RS1800 went on to win

in Portugal, Greece, New Zealand and Canada – securing the 1979 World Rally Championship for Makes.

the 1980s

Ford's Formula One success continued with Jones and Rosberg in Williams cars, and Piquet in a Brabham. Michele Alboreto drove the unstoppable DFV engine to its 155th Grand Prix win in Detroit.

In the mid-80s, Ford put an exclusive cat among the pigeons with the introduction of 200 race-bred steel and carbon-fibre chassised, four-wheel drive, turbo-charged Cosworth BDT-engined monsters – the RS200.

zakspeed ford**capri** turbo **1981**

The 1981 German Racing
Championship was taken by storm
with Klaus Ludwig at the wheel of this
giant of sports and touring car racing.
Built in Germany, the super-fast
Zakspeed Ford Capri coupé
looked and behaved like the
ultimate predator.

fordsierra RS500 1987

In competition, the 500 hp, 2-litre RS500 was virtually unbeatable, winning the 1987 World Touring Car Championship, the 1988 European Touring Car Championship and successive British Touring Car Championships from 1987 to 1990. In fact, it proved so dominant that the motorsport governing body changed championship rules to give the opposition a chance to catch the awesome Sierra!



the 1990s

This was the decade in which Ayrton Senna and Michael Schumacher, widely regarded as two of the greatest drivers in modern Formula One racing, won successive World Championship races in Ford-powered cars. In 1990 and '91, Nelson Piquet also won three International Grands Prix in a Benetton-Ford.




lola**ford** T93 **1993**



Nigel Mansell

Having switched from World F1 to American Indycar, new-kidon-the-block Nigel Mansell took the 1993 Indycar Championship in his Lola-Ford. In the same year,

Senna won five Grands Prix for McLaren-Ford, Paul Radisich won the FIA Touring Car World Cup in his Mondeo and François Delecour in an Escort Cosworth beat all-comers in the WRC in Portugal.

benettonford B194 1994

With the introduction of a smaller, lighter yet more powerful Zetec-R V8 engine, Michael Schumacher celebrated victories at the wheel of his Benetton-Ford B194 in the first three Grands Prix of the season. Five further victories were to follow, powering the rising star to his first Drivers' Championship – and Ford's first since Keke Rosberg in 1982.

In World Rally, François Delecour also started 1994 in style. His Ford Escort RS Cosworth carried him to victory in the season's opener, the Monte Carlo Rally.



fordtaurus nascar 1999

With a 5.9-litre V8 engine capable of developing over 700 bhp, the Taurus was Ford Racing's American star and won the NASCAR Winston Cup Series in 1999.

ford team mondeo 2000

More than 40 years after its first British Touring Car Championship victory, Ford ended its series participation in 2000 with a clean sweep of awards.


Ford Team Mondeo powered its way to the manufacturers' title, even before the season ended. Then, in a closely fought night-time showdown at Silverstone, the scores were finally settled. Before the race, any of Ford's racers could have won the coveted prize. But after a fantastic


performance, Alain Menu was crowned champion, with Anthony Reid a close second and former champion Rickard Rydell third.

En route to the titles, Ford Team Mondeo notched



up two more amazing milestones; Ford's 500th BTCC victory, recorded by Alain Menu at Oulton Park and, as the result of a stylish 1-2-3 finish at Donington Park, Ford claimed the first clean sweep by a manufacturer team in the modern era of Super Touring racing.

WRC 2000 season

Whilst Colin McRae was pipped at the post for the FIA World Rally Championship, the Ford Martini World Rally Team is still regarded by many as the best in the world; enough for the Focus to be voted 'Rally Car of the Year 2000' by the readers of *Autosport* magazine. Perhaps it was because McRae led home a Ford one-two on the gruelling Acropolis Rally. Or because team-mate Carlos Sainz repeated the feat on the Cyprus Rally in September.





ford's rallying 'ladder of **opportunity**'

During Ford's long heritage in rallying, many promising drivers have developed into rally champions. Ford is continuing to nurture rallying talent with the newly-announced 'Ladder of Opportunity'.

This initiative is designed to give a structured route to the top of the

Since its inception in 1967, Formula Ford has helped many young drivers towards a glittering Formula One career. Michael Schumacher, Ayrton Senna, Nigel Mansell, Damon Hill, Eddie Irvine and David Coulthard, to name but a few, all passed through its ranks.

Until 1993, the cars were powered by a 1.6-litre Ford engine. Today's cars use the modern 1.8-litre Zetec engine, derived from the unit found in many of Ford's road cars, with teams free to choose a chassis from a number of manufacturers.
